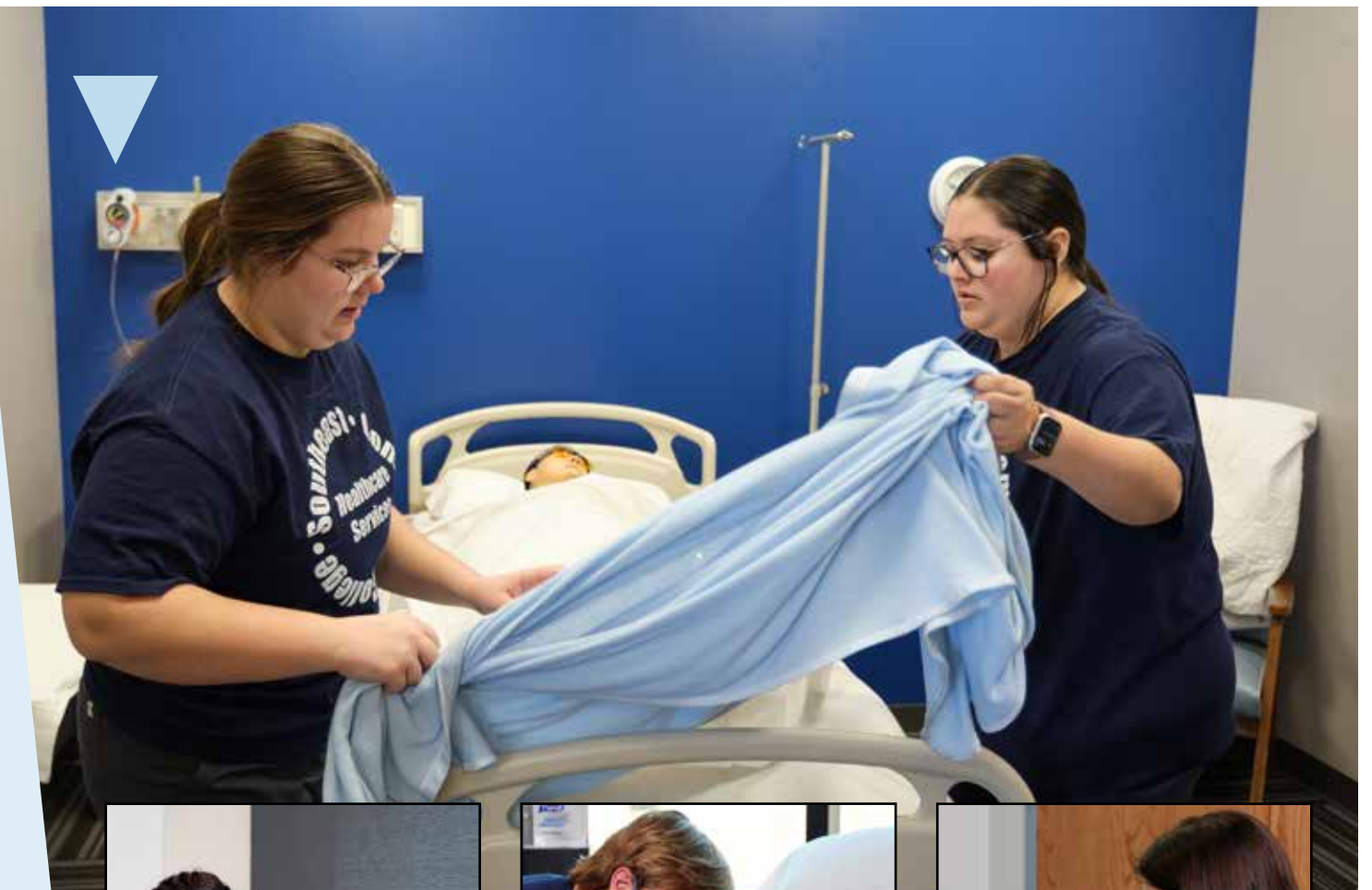
The SCC Experience
